

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## Rector's Ramblings

As I sit to write my newsletter article I am aware that it is stewardship time of year. Every year about this time we start thinking about next year (I know it is hard to believe since it isn't even November yet) and the church budget. That of course means that it is time to send out the annual stewardship letter, that Cathy Jenkins does such a wonderful job with. The stewardship letter is intended to get you all thinking about your pledge to the church and how much you might pledge for next year. Once all the pledge cards are in, the finance committee meets to work out the budget for the next year. This is the "business side of church"; the necessary work that must be done to run the church but pledging is much more than that. Pledging is really mostly about you and God.

Pledging is all about stewardship. When God created human beings and put them over the earth and all earthly things that God created, God made us stewards of all God created. A while back Tom Peterson saw some of the information that St. John's Broad Creek put out about stewardship and asked if we could use some of it. Here is what they had to say about what a steward is: "A Steward is someone who protects and nurtures someone else's property. A Christian steward is responsible for God's property: the gift of life, the gift of this abundant earth, the love of Christ, the Holy Spirit within every human being, the love and fellowship of family and friends. Stewardship is a way for Christians to show heart-felt thanks for these gifts. The steward does so by serving the church in three basic ways: (1) utilizing ones God-given *talents* in service to the church community, (2) allocating meaningful *time* in support of the church's mission of outreach and (3) giving back a percentage of ones *treasure* to sustain the corporate body of the church: its programs, its staff and the physical plant. The biblical standard of giving is the tithe, or 1/10 of income. One is expected to try to work towards this level by starting at about 3% of income and then making regular increases each year. This approach is called "striving to tithe"."


And what does the church do with the financial gifts you offer? Yes, we pay the bills - we keep the lights on, heat the church, pay Jonathan and me, buy office supplies and so on. But reality is, even paying the bills, is all part of the mission and ministry of God being done right here, right now through each and every one of us.

This is all to say that our giving to the church is one of (I do know that most of us also give to many other organizations that help to heal our broken world) the ways we give back to God to show our gratitude for God's gifts and blessings given to us each and every day. Stewardship and pledging certainly does have an aspect of "the business of the church" but it is so much more than that, it is about giving thanks, it is about doing God's work, it is about you and God.


